

St. Mary's C of E Primary School, Timsbury Primary School PE and Sport Funding Statement 2017-2018

Purpose of funding

The government has providing additional funding to schools to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Amount of funding

Allocation of funding is calculated using the number of pupils in Year 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded on the January 2016 Census. The total amount of grant received for 2017-2018 at St Mary's is £17,450 (estimated).

Spending the funding

We will use the funding to cover the costs of:

- Creating an Assistant Headteacher post within the school with specific responsibility for Physical Education across the school. The post holder is expected to develop, monitor and evaluate the curriculum and sports provision; to evaluate the impact of PE and Sports Premium expenditure on participation and attainment; and to train staff so that all PE teaching is delivered effectively by our own teachers. The post holder will also be expected to work with the wider staff team and develop our sporting clubs and participation in cross-school events. It is anticipated that this approach will result in higher quality and sustainable PE provision for the children at St Mary's. (£5000)
- A fully trained Forest School Teacher and resources, in order to promote outdoor physical activity to all (£6,000)
- Continuing to take advantage of sporting opportunities available through local partnerships and build on children's skills from previous years in Lacrosse and Tennis
- Increasing the range of sporting clubs on offer gymnastics, football and running and encouraging specific pupils to participate in school sports clubs
- Holding an annual Healthy Schools Week (£1000)
- Extending pupil involvement in the Dance Umbrella and Cross School Competitions (£1500 supply costs)
- Enhancing the range of gymnastics and dance resources (£2500)
- Enhancing playground physical activity (£2000)

Monitoring

Governors will monitor the impact of expenditure on participation and attainment via termly reports from the Assistant Headteacher to the Curriculum and Standards Committee/FGB
