Task 1

Write a setting description inspired by this picture. Think about the moon, clouds, castle, rocks and boats and how you might describe them.



Task 2

'The sound' on its own is a simple noun phrase. It is made up of a determiner (the) and a noun (sound.) To make this more interesting we can turn it into an expanded noun phrase. You do this by adding in one or two adjectives before the noun. Improve these sentences by identifying the simple noun phrases and improving them by adding adjectives. Number 1 has been done for you.

1. In the distance, the sound of waves could be heard crashing against the shore.
In the distance, the gentle sound of waves could be heard crashing against the shore.

2. The Viking raised his sword in the air whilst marching forward.

3. The tower stood in the background, watching as the Vikings marched on.

4. In his hand, he held a shield which was used for protection.

Task 3

Go back to your writing that you did in task 1. Use what you learnt during task 2 and edit your writing to make it more descriptive and interesting. You might add some expanded noun phrases or you might choose to improve some vocabulary and spelling.

Task 4
