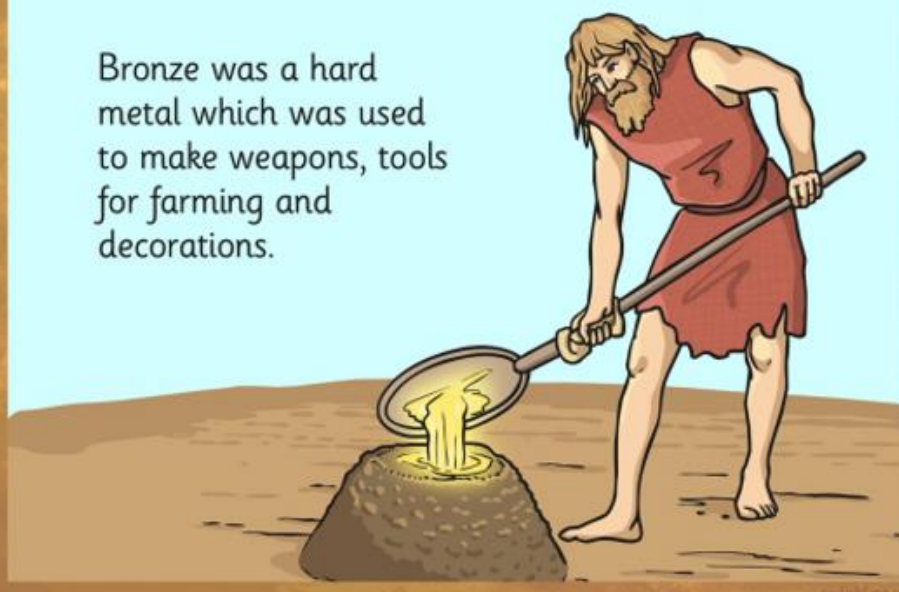

The Bronze Age is the beginning of making metal in Britain. Things will never be the same again.

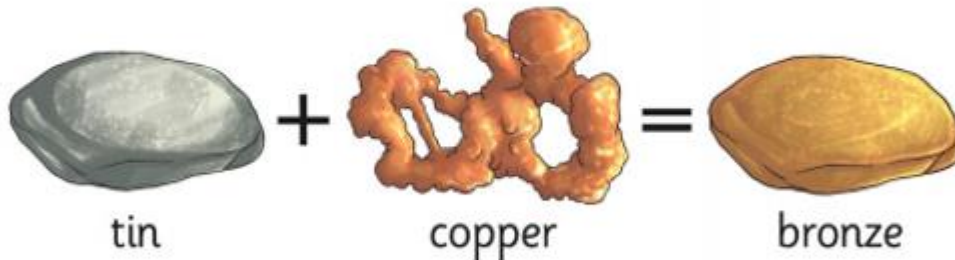
It is possible that bronze was first brought over to Britain by the 'Bell Beaker People'. They were named after the distinctive bell-shaped pottery that they made, mainly used for drinking from.



Bronze was a hard metal which was used to make weapons, tools for farming and decorations.



Bronze is an alloy (a mix of metals). It is made from 90% copper and 10% tin.



Copper and tin were mined.

Bronze was made using a furnace.

Metal tools had a huge impact on farming.

It was much easier to clear forests and grow more crops.

The loom was invented and woollen clothes first appeared.

Stone circles were built as meeting places and sites of religious importance.
